1. Introduction

SkyBallTM is an exciting racket sport that combines elements of tennis and pickleball. This rulebook governs all official SkyBallTM matches and tournaments.

All sanctioned events must abide by these rules unless otherwise authorized in writing by JBC Ventures LLC.

2. Court Specifications & Equipment

- Court Size: 44 feet long x 20 feet wide (singles & doubles)
- Net Height: 34 inches at center, 36 inches at sidelines
- Racquets: 21-inch stringed racquets (textured or hexagonal strings prohibited)
- **Balls:** High-density foam balls approved by SkyBallTM

3. Match Formats

- **SkyBall Quickplay:** Single game to 11 points (win by 2)
- Tournament Play: Best-of-3, best-of-5, or best-of-7 games (win by 2)
- Players/teams change ends:
 - After every game in multi-game matches
 - o In Quickplay matches or the final game of a series: every **multiple of 6 total points** scored in the game (e.g., 6–0, 2–4, 1–5, 10–2, 12–12).

4. Match Start & Side Selection

- Matches begin with a **coin toss**.
- Winner of the toss chooses either:
 - o To serve first, or
 - Which side of the court to start on.
- The **loser of the toss** chooses the remaining option.

5. Serving Rules

5.1 General

- Only one serve attempt per point.
- Serves touching the net and landing in the correct service area are "lets" and must be replayed.
- The returner must allow the serve to bounce before hitting it.

5.2 Serving

5.2.1 Standard Play Option

- Serve underhand only.
- Serve crosscourt anywhere in bounds (including kitchen in adapted pickleball courts).

5.2.2 Service Box Option

- Any serve style allowed.
- Must land in the diagonal service box (between 12-foot service line and the net).

5.3 Official Play Serving Sequence (Mandatory for Official/Tournament Play)

- The first serve of the match is delivered by the server standing on the left side of their baseline.
- The **first server** serves only **one point**, then service passes to the opposing team/player, who begins serving from the **right side**.
- Even-numbered point totals (0–0, 1–1, 2–0, etc.) are served from the left side.
- Odd-numbered point totals (0–1, 1–0, 2–1, etc.) are served from the right side.
- Including after the initial serve of the match, the serve always switches for **odd-numbered point** totals
- The first serve after each side change (following a game) resumes on the left side.

6. Scoring System

- Games are played to 11 points, win by 2.
- The **initial serving player** serves **one point**; thereafter, service alternates in **two-point increments** (except where modified by tournament format).

7. Gameplay Regulations

- After the serve, the receiving side must make at least **one groundstroke** before volleying the ball.
- If a player releases their racquet to make a shot, the shot counts if the racquet does not land on the opponent's side or hit the net during the live point.
- If the ball contacts any part of a player's body during a live point, that player loses the point.
- If the ball contacts any part of a line, it is considered in.

8. Doubles Specific Rules

• At least one player from each team must be standing within the court bounds (not in an out-of-bounds area) until the ball bounces in the court.

9. Faults

A fault results in loss of the point. Faults include:

- Ball hit out of bounds
- Ball fails to clear net
- Ball bounces twice before being hit

- Serve lands outside correct service area
- Player (or player's racquet) touches the net or enters opponent's court during play
- Reaching over the net to hit the ball before it crosses to your side
- Foot fault on serve (server steps on or over baseline before contact)
- Double hit (ball hit twice in one stroke)
- Carry (ball held on racquet strings during stroke)

10. Tournament Oversight

- Any tournament held under the SkyBallTM name must be approved by **JBC Ventures LLC**.
- Tournament directors must be approved by **JBC Ventures LLC** and SkyBallTM.
- Approved tournament directors are responsible for:
 - Ensuring all matches follow this official rulebook.
 - Acting in the **spirit of SkyBallTM** to make fair, reasonable decisions in situations not explicitly covered by the rules.
 - Maintaining player safety, fair play, and sportsmanship.
 - Handling disputes in accordance with the principles of fairness and consistency.

11. Equipment Compliance & Approval

 All balls, racquets, and court modifications must be approved by JBC Ventures LLC for official play.

12. Amendments to the Rules

JBC Ventures LLC reserves the right to amend these rules. All official rule changes will be published on SkyBall.us and take effect on the stated date.
